

Ways to help out at home

Reading –We will be enjoying reading a poetry collection out loud in school, which is excellent for developing children's oracy skills. We encourage you to do the same - any collection by Michael Rosen is usually a hit!

Writing – Practice your formal letter writing skills by writing a letter to your local MP about an issue you feel strongly about! Our local MP Abtisam Mohammed is a friend of the school and always happy to hear from his constituents. paul.blomfield.mp@parliament.uk

Tea time talk (Oracy) –Which lessons did you do this afternoon? What key knowledge can you tell me from them? What new words have you learned in your writing lessons? Can you set me a maths question from your learning this morning to see if I can solve it? You might be better than me!

Maths – Use the Whiterose workbooks that have been sent home at the end of each unit to retrieve and practice learning from the year so far. Correcting mistakes and tackling incomplete questions in your old workbooks would be a great start.

SATs – Check that your child is feeling relaxed and happy around SATs. They should be well-prepared at this point in the year. We will be doing more work to help them get ready in school, but we try to get the balance between hard work and downtime. Please let us know if you have any concerns about your child's wellbeing, and you can help out by finding lots of time for relaxation and hobbies in the evenings.
