

Primary Schools Festival November 2024



This November saw our bi-annual Primary Schools Festival prove once again to be a huge success. Delivered by Apex Squash and Racketball Programme, the festival saw participation from Hunters Bar, St Wilfids, Nether Green and Ecclesall.
